

I wonder how many of us know what our "Faith Potential or Faith Factor" really is. These terms address the importance our faith plays in all our decisions and in the daily living of our lives as Christians and followers of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. When there is a decision that needs to be made, do we involve our faith as one of the factors that help us make the decision? When something happens in our lives, do we call upon our faith to help us handle the situation? When we begin the day or end the day, do we begin and end with prayers that praise God for His goodness and presence with us throughout our day? "Faith Factor" is the importance faith plays in all aspects of our life. Is our "Faith Factor" active?

One of my favorite stories is the one where the lumberjack comes into the hardware store to buy a new ax and saw to help him cut down trees and chop wood. The salesman persuades the lumberiack to consider a chainsaw. The chainsaw, he says, will help him cut more wood than he has ever been able to previously imagine. So out the door he goes carrying a brand new chainsaw. Four days later he comes back to the hardware store demanding a refund. The salesman wants to know "Why? Didn't it help?" The dissatisfied lumberjack complains it didn't help him a bit. The first day he was only able to cut down one tree and one cord of wood. The second day he was only able to cut down one tree. And the third day he could only cut one cord of wood. He concludes by saying there must be something wrong with the saw. The salesman asks to see the saw. Taking the saw in his hands, he pulls on the cord and it starts right up. The lumberjack looks at the salesman and says, "Oh, I didn't know it cranked up."

I love that story because in so many ways it points out the limits we place on our lives and on the power of our faith by not allowing our faith and our Lord to do the things they promise to do for us. All too often we are trying to handle life and everything that comes with life without ever permitting our faith to guide and support us. The gift of faith is the gift of knowing that we have a God who loves us and promises always to be with us, even to the end of the ages. Faith assures us that

nothing can ever separate us from the God who created us and all that exists. Faith celebrates the joys of life with us and comforts us in our moments of sadness or fear or even doubt. Sometimes our faith is strong - sometimes it is not. But regardless of where your faith is at the moment, the best advice there is, is this: Just believe!

If any of us would like to start the engine of our faith, then we need to increase the "Faith Factor" that is a part of our lives. In theory it is not so hard, but in practice it might be a bit more difficult. If you want to increase your "Faith Factor," increase the time you spend in prayer and praise of God and allow God to guide you through the seconds, moments, hours and days of your life. A simple beginning to increasing our "Faith Factor" would involve: beginning and ending your day in prayer; thinking through the events in your life within a framework that asks how God is present in the midst of this moment; taking your decisions (both large and small) to God, allowing Him to help vou finalize them; and trusting God to keep His promises to always be present with you. You see, it doesn't appear to be that difficult and it's not - if you recognize your need to crank the engine of your faith and let it roar to your rescue. I hope each of us will consider growing our "Faith Factor" as we enjoy this life that God has blessed us with.

South Carolina Lutheran Youth Convention News

On June 18, 2015 the Youth Ministry Cabinet met at Newberry College to prepare for the LCY Convention. The young leaders wanted to do something in response to the shooting at Emanuel AME Church. The following resolution was passed:

Resolution Against Racial Injustice

WHEREAS the population in South Carolina is approximately 65% white and 35% other races/ethnic groups;

AND WHEREAS ON June 17, 2015, 9 people were martyred at Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, SC because of the color of their skin;

AND WHEREAS we, as children of God, are called to Rise Up Together and befriend ALL of our neighbors in their every need...

BE IT RESOLVED that the Lutheran Church Youth organization of the South Carolina Synod, ELCA urges all of its members to continue to

- Stand in support of inclusiveness, embracing diversity, and loving all through Christ;
- Participate with leaders in our schools and communities to enact and enforce policies of equality without regard to race or ethnicity;
- Reach out to and pray for the victims AND wrongdoers to show them the love of Christ is everlasting; and
- Look for outreach opportunities in all Christian churches to grow together in the body of Christ.
