"Taking Your Place In The Drama"

For many of us our favorite time of the year is here. By the time this Herald reaches us in our homes, we will have already celebrated the Thanksgiving holiday and vowed again to trim off the excess pounds we put on as we stuffed ourselves on stuffing and turkey. We will also be entering Advent and beginning our plans to celebrate Christmas and the birth of our Lord. It is indeed a "most wonderful time of the year."

It is also the time when we read and think about the wonderful Christmas gospel that provides us with so many of the facts surrounding the birth of Jesus. There was a decree that a census be taken and a tax imposed. There was an excited young man in love with an even younger woman. There was a birth, a boy, and a manger. There were shepherds, an angel, and then a heavenly chorus. With the shepherds were sheep and we think numerous other animals, as all this took place outside the inn. And God's glory shone everywhere.

I never enter this holy season without thinking of all the moving parts and people that were in motion as God came into the world as a tiny baby. Even the stars lined up to confirm a Savior was born, a Savior given to redeem us and bring forgiveness to a sinful humanity. I always think of how God's glory was seen by each of the participants in this miraculous birth and then of what each one did with what they saw and experienced.

The virgin Mary is the easiest to consider, for Luke tells us that she treasured what she had heard and pondered all these events in her heart.

We really don't know what Joseph did because we are never told. But I have my suspicions. Joseph accepted the responsibility God placed under his care and then did everything he could to be a protective and loving earthly father.

The shepherds? Well, the shepherds experienced fear, curiosity, and then belief and joy enough to go out into their neighborhoods and the surrounding hills praising God for what they had heard and seen.

Even the sheep were undoubtedly changed as the glory of God shown all around them and the heavenly chorus tuned up to sing the praises of God for what He has done.

As Christmas approaches, each of us has an opportunity to take our place in this drama surrounding the birth of Jesus. We can listen and ponder its meaning. We can accept the responsibilities God places on us and act in such a way that we reflect God's love to others. We can be afraid and dismiss the story; be curious and pursue the story; believe the story and experience its joy so that we share it with others. We can bask in the glory of God all around us and listen for the sound of the heavenly chorus in our life. The one thing it is impossible to do, however, is to hear the story and do nothing.

That's the reason this is the most wonderful time of the year and really of creation. The drama of Christ's coming and birth is that it calls us to become a part of His story. While our children's Christmas pageants have what we call extras, the drama of our Lord's birth calls all of us to take a part and a place in the telling of His story to all the world. Whether we share our reflections, our sense of Christian response and responsibility, our curiosity, belief and joy, or even turn our ears to the sound of the chorus, one cannot simply watch. The glory of God shines too bright for us to do nothing.

My prayer for us this Advent is that we prepare ourselves for what God is doing and at Christmas find our place among the characters being called to witness that "unto us is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord" (*Luke 2:11*).

This Christmas, ponder which part and role God is calling you to accept and share, and have a Merry Christmas!

St. John's Congregational Meeting

Per Rule VI, Section 1 of the Rules of The Lutheran Church of German Protestants (St. John's Lutheran Church) a Congregational Meeting will be held on December 8, 2013 following the worship service. To make the Congregational Meeting easier for all members to attend, the Church Vestry has approved the combining of the 8:30 AM and the 11:00 AM service into one service held at 10:00 AM with the meeting to immediately follow the worship service.

The Congregational meeting is being held to elect officers, members to Vestry, approve the 2014 Mission Budget, and to affirm the appointment of a Trustee to the Endowment Committee. Nominated as officers are: President – Dan Prickett; Vice President – Dan Lackland; Secretary – Gayle Hilton; Treasurer – Anne Lake. Nominated for election to Vestry are: Chris Antley, Deborah Bussey, William Dowd, and Peter Holmi. Recommended for appointment to the Endowment Committee is Frickie Martschink, III. The amount of the recommended 2014 St. John's Mission Budget is \$454,500.

Voting Members of the congregation are confirmed members who have communed and made a contribution of record during the current of preceding year.

Every member of the congregation is encouraged to be present for the annual Congregational Meeting.

Property Committee Needs Expertise

As our congregation knows, St. John's has a huge physical plant encompassing the Sanctuary, Parish Building, 2 parking lots, and almost an acre of land. Without a sextant or property manager, it is a huge undertaking to take care of the everyday needs of maintaining our property. This ranges from building, roof, hvac, repairs, cleaning of the interior and exterior, plumbing, electrical, landscaping, computers, phones, kitchen, and the list goes on and on. Most of this is handled by the staff and property committee.

As I listened to the Pastor's sermon today about stewardship, he made some good points about not only our financial stewardship but also giving of our time and talents, and that all of us have many talents, whether we recognize them or not.

The Property Committee could use your help and expertise. While, we do have good contractors who take care of the bigger needs and issues we do have on a fairly regular basis, there are a number of items that are either too small or too expensive to be done by an outside service. A few of us already help with these things which can range from changing light bulbs, to minor painting, to cleaning up after an event, or taking down the Christmas tree. Most of these projects only take a couple of hours perhaps once or twice per month.

As they say, many hands make light work! If you are willing and can offer help in any areas like carpentry, painting, gardening and landscaping, electrical, plumbing, computers, event set-up or clean up, we can definitely use you and need you!

VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The St. John's Vestry reports

the following highlights and decisions from the November meeting.

- 1) The Vestry Meeting was called to order by President Mike Andersen and opened with prayer by Pastor Butler.
- 2) The October 2013 Treasurer's Report was received as information.
- 3) The October Vestry Meeting Minutes were approved.
- 4) Pastor Butler recommended for membership Tom and Lynn Springer, Debra Green-Fletcher, and Jennifer Green. Approved. Pastor also recommended that Brooke Hackmann be granted permission for her wedding to be held at St. John's Lutheran Church on June 21, 2014. Approved.
- 5) The Christian Education Committee reported the search continues for the position of "Director of Christian Education, Youth and Family Ministries." The Committee also noted that the Children's Christmas Pageant will be held on Sunday, December 15th beginning at 5:30 PM. The Committee recommended that we combine our worship services on January 26, 2014 so that we may honor our members 75 years of age and wiser with the Second Annual Celebration of their contributions and a luncheon following the 10:00 AM service. Approved.
- 6) The Finance Committee recommended we approve the 2014 Mission Budget and submit to the congregation for approval at the 2013 Congregational Meeting to be held on December 8, 2013. Approved.
- 7) The Property Committee noted the following items: trimming and pruning of trees in the cemetery and parking lot completed; repairs on the Clifford Street sidewalk completed; a contract for a new cleaning service with Jan-Pro Cleaning approved; range hood in the kitchen inspected and is compliant; a truck turning around on Clifford Street backed into and damaged the handrails on the parish building; a new "Caution" sign warning people of the fragile nature of our gravestones has been ordered; and we continue to monitor and treat the fire ant situation.
- 8) The Social Ministry Committee reported on the Christmas Box Project for the Charleston Senior Center, and that we will sponsor one more Hope Lodge Dinner remaining in 2013.
- 9) The Vestry approved sending to the congregation the names of nominees to serve as Officers of the Vestry and Congregation, four nominees to be elected to Vestry, the 2014 Mission Budget of our church, and the name of a Trustee to be appointed to the Endowment Committee.
- 10) The next Vestry meeting will be held on Thursday, December 19, 2013 at 6:30 PM. Preceding the Vestry meeting, the Vestry officers will meet to finalize the Agenda beginning at 5:30 PM and the Vestry will enjoy Christmas fellowship with the staff at 6:00 PM.



Because He First...

STEWARDSHIP 2013 - 2014

Ephesians 2: 8-10 "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

Starting around the first of November, and utilizing the theme *Because He First...*, we have had the opportunity to explore various aspects of what it means to live the life of a faithful steward of our great and gracious God. I believe most of us understand that all that we are and everything we have comes from Him. Over the course of the next few months I hope we will all come to better understand that how we live each day the Lord gives us is a measure of our gratitude to Him for His grace and mercy in our lives, and, most importantly, for the gift of eternal life.

God emphasizes stewardship among those who live in God's grace through the Spirit. The Apostle Paul, with his customary bluntness, says in 2 Corinthians 8: 8-9 "I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, so that you through His poverty might become rich."

Please look carefully at the picture that begins this article. It is taken from Michelangelo's "Creation of Adam". As I looked at larger color versions of this image I was immediately struck by the fact that it appeared God's thumb was dirty. Maybe it appears that way because of its age, or maybe it's because of Michelangelo's genius and enormous attention to detail. Then it hit me, "Of course God's hands are dirty, He created Adam from the dust of the ground." As I thought about the idea more, I realized that everything else in the creation story came into existence through the spoken word of God. He made an exception, however, for people and chose to personally craft us with His own hands and equip us with gifts for service. He didn't have to do that, but He did.

What have you done to let Him know you appreciate it? How often do you use the gifts He gave you to serve others? How faithfully and generously do you give to support His work in and through St. John's? *Because He First* ensured our salvation by grace through faith in Jesus, we don't have to use the gifts we've been given to inherit eternal life. Rather, we get to use them, and we should want to use them *Because He First* gave them to us.
