## VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

St. John's Vestry met on Thursday night, January 16, 2014, to discuss and conduct the business of the church. The meeting was called to order by President Dan Prickett and opened with a prayer offered by Pastor Butler.

- 1) New Vestry members were present, and introductions were made. It was quickly noted that for some Vestry members this was their first time serving the church in this way.
- 2) Pastor Butler and Dan Prickett then led the Vestry on a tour of the church facilities and explained responsibilities of a Vestry member serving as the manager for the buildings.
- 3) The December 2013 Vestry Meeting Minutes were approved as submitted.
- 4) The December 2013 Treasurer's Report was reviewed and received as information.
- 5) Committee Reports:
  - a. The Officers requested that the Vestry meet on February 8, 2014, for a half-day retreat to discuss the goals of our church for 2014. This retreat will take place off-site at the Hendrick BMW meeting room. The importance of attendance at Vestry meetings was also discussed and it was requested that each of us make attendance a priority on our schedules.
  - b. Pastor Butler shared information about the membership numbers of our congregation, average attendance for the year, and that on Christmas Eve we were able to celebrate the birth of our Lord in worship with 337 persons. During Pastor's report we also approved the request from Sarah Kiel to hold her wedding here at St. John's in June, 2014.
  - c. The Christian Education Committee was pleased with the Children's Christmas Pageant and the occasion to honor Mrs. Betty Evans for her many years of teaching in our Sunday School program. Sheila also mentioned the upcoming single service on January 26, followed by the covered dish dinner honoring our 75 year and older members.
  - d. The Evangelism Committee will again have our newly designed T-shirts for sale before and after the single service on January 26.
  - e. The Social Ministry Committee reported that our efforts over Christmas had made it possible to deliver over 100 boxes to the Crisis Ministries Center and 90 boxes to the Senior Center. George Galante is leading the committee in a discussion of criteria to be used in determining the "hows" of charitable giving. The possibility of supper clubs in 2014 was discussed.
  - f. The Vestry thanked Deborah Bussey for coordinating the Christmas decorations at the church, and Deborah shared her thanks to and for the many others who participated to make St. John's the beautiful and reverent place of worship it was for the celebration of the nativity of our Lord.
- 6) There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
